

**Enter the BearCat** In the wake of the shocking 1997 bank robbery shoot-out in North Hollywood, the Los Angeles Police Department watched helplessly as officers and civilians were pinned down by gunfire. In that incident, two heavily armed men fired more than 1,100 rounds of ammunition, wounding 11 officers, 5 civilians, and destroyed 10 police cars.
